SNOW CLEARING

PLEASE BE ADVISED: It is illegal to dump snow onto a public roadway.

This notice is for those locals who push snow across a public roadway, which leads to narrowing of roads, the buildup of snow that can be dangerous to motorists, and a nuisance to other residents. A number of cases have been reported to the council office and further action will have to be taken if this continues.

PROSTATE AWARENESS SEMINAR

The Reidville Fire Department will be holding a Prostate Awareness Seminar on January 21, 2013. This seminar will be held at the Reidville Community Hall and begin at 7:00 p.m. (approx. an hour). This will be open to all residents.

EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY

The town has received some additional funding under the Community Enhancement Employment Program and is seeking 1 to 2 workers (depending on the number of hours a person requires to qualify for EI) to work on the trail system.

- These positions pay minimum wage.
- All positions are open to both men and woman.
- Workers can be employed for up to 400 hours.
- Individuals who require more than 400 hours of project employment in order to obtain EI benefits are not eligible to participate.
- Individuals must qualify for EI by the end of the Project. For further information regarding EI eligibility is available for Service Canada.

Please ride on the road or on the edges of the fields. When spring breaks, please refrain from the sod fields altogether to protect the crops. Thank you.

TAX COLLECTION

As of January 14, 2013 the town's collection rate for 2012 stands at 99.20%. Compared with the same time last year, the town's collection rate is down from 99.28%.

NOTE: All seniors (65 years of age or older - or turning 65 any time during 2013) are eligible for an additional 5% discount. Please advise the office if you will reach the age of 65 during the 2013 year so that your taxes can be adjusted to reflect the discount on your 2013 tax bill.

CORRECTION 2013 BUDGET

Because of the due diligence of council there will be a decrease in the **mill rate** (not a decrease in property tax as was stated in the December newsletter) for the 2013 year to compensate for the higher assessment values. The rate will drop from 7.5% to 6%! All other rates will remain the same.

GARBAGE COLLECTION

Recently there has been some problems

with garbage collection. Please note garbage must be put out before 8 a.m. on garbage day....the truck makes one run through town...it your garbage is not out at that time it will not be picked up. Also, please ensure that your garbage is in large bags not small kitchen catchers this causes a delay for the truck. Thank You!

ANIMAL CONCERNS

There have been some concerns brought to the office concerning roaming dogs. These dogs are tearing up garbage, leaving droppings on other people's property, being a nuisance etc. Please be more respectful of your neighbors! According to the town's bylaws a dog has to be on a leash or tethered at all times. Please ensure that you follow this bylaw or measures will have to be taken. We are in the process of working with the Newfoundland Animal Health Division to see what we can do in cases where we cannot catch an animal or an animal is let out after hours.

Please note that any resident has a right to call the RCMP if this event is taking place repeatedly and furthermore charges can be laid.

HEALTH TIPS
