DISCOUNTS

All taxes have been sent out in the mail. In order to receive the 5% discount available on your current year taxes, the invoice will have to be paid in full by January 31st. There is a smaller discount available for February. If your current year taxes are paid in full by February 29th you are entitled to a 3% discount. Any resident who turns 65 years of age in 2016 will be eligible for an additional 5% senior's discount. You may be exempt from Poll Tax if your previous year's income is below the basic personal exemption for the previous year. The amount for 2015 was \$11,138. You must have a copy of last year's tax return notice of assessment to qualify.

STREETLIGHTS

If you notice a streetlight out in your area you can report it to Newfoundland Power by logging into the website www.newfoundlandpower.com and click on the link "Report a Streetlight Out". If this is not an option please call the town office.

The town has a chance to get the special price of \$21.99 plus HST on the compost bins from MMSB. We have to order a minimum of 25 to get this special price and the order has to be placed by Monday, February 8th. If you would like to have one of these bins please call the town office by Friday, February 5th. We need to have a preorder of at least half to order.

FITNESS CENTER

BUDGET 2016

Because of the due diligence of council there will be a mill rate decrease from 6% to 5% to compensate for some of the increase in property assessments. The water rates for the 2016 year will increase from \$300.00 to \$310.00.
