**RECYCLING**

The Reidville Volunteer Fire Department along with the Reidville Recreation Committee will be “sharing” all recycling proceeds from the town in coming months.

If you have recycling you would like to contribute, you can either place it beside your garbage box on garbage day or drop it off to the Depot in Deer Lake and tell the staff it is for the “Reidville Volunteer Fire Dept”. Thank you for your support.

**NOTE:** Before you place your recyclables out for collection, please ensure that **all caps are removed**. The Recycling Depot will **NOT** take any item that has a cap on it.

Also, milk containers are not recyclable.

- Commercial: \$200.00 per building
  - New House: \$100.00
  - House Extension: \$50.00
  - Accessory Buildings: \$25.00
  - General Repairs: \$10.00

There is No Charge for a General Repairs permit for

Seniors.

**Please Note:** All taxes for prior years must be paid in full before a permit will be issued.
