SNOWCLEARING

PLEASE BE ADVISED: It is illegal to dump snow onto a public roadway.

This notice is for those locals who push snow across a public roadway, which leads to narrowing of roads, the buildup of snow that can be dangerous to motorists, and a nuisance to other residents. A number of cases have been reported to the council office and further action will have to be taken if this continues. Also, there have recently been some problems on some of the byroads with snowclearing. This is due to the new paving and ditching and council is looking into having this situation remedied. Until this can be taken care of council are asking residents to use caution when traveling on the byroads.
