## DISCOUNTS

If your current year taxes are paid in full by February  $28_{\text{th}}$  you are entitled to a 3% discount. Any resident who turns 65 years of age in 2016 will be eligible for an additional 5% senior's discount You may be exempt from Poll Tax if your previous year's income is below the basic personal exemption for the previous year. The amount for 2016 was \$11,474.00. You must have a copy of last year's tax return notice of assessment to qualify.

#### **FITNESS CENTER**
