HEALTH TIP

MARCH IS NATIONAL NUTRITION MONTH!

Proper nutrition is essential in maintaining good health and fitness. A well balanced diet, in conjunction with consistent exercise, is key in being healthy, fit, and feeling good about yourself.

The American Dietetic Association (ADA) recommendations for daily percentages for diet are as follows:

Carbohydrates: 55 - 60%

Proteins: 12 - 15% Fat: 25 - 30%

Saturated Fat: <10%

As of March 8, 2010, the town's collection rate for 2010 stands at 96.28%. Compared with the same time last year, the town's collection rate is up from 95.95%

To those residents in arrears and not honoring agreements, please note that further action is being taken!



NOTE: All seniors (65 years of age or older - or turning 65 any time during 2010) are eligible for an additional 5% discount.
