SNOWCLEARING

PLEASE BE ADVISED: It is illegal to dump snow onto a public roadway.

This notice is for those locals who push snow across a public roadway, which leads to narrowing of roads, the buildup of snow that can be dangerous to motorists, and a nuisance to other residents.

With the amount of snow that we have it is becoming extremely dangerous as the roads are becoming narrower and the plow is having a hard time removing it. Please be considerate of your neighbours. The snow that you put out on the road in a lot of cases ends up in someone else's driveway. We have a list of names of people who are doing this and we will be discussing this with the RCMP to see what they suggest.

The snow plow operator will be trying to widen some of the byroads and may have to deposit snow on people's boundaries. This will be kept to a minimum but there may be circumstances where it is unavoidable. We apologize for any inconvenience this may cause.

TAX COLLECTION

As of March 7th the town's collection rate for 2014 stands at 69.73%. Compared with the same time last year, the town's collection rate is up from 66.93%.

NOTE: All seniors (65 years of age or older - or turning 65 any time during 2014) are eligible for an

additional 5% discount. Please advise the office if you will reach the age of 65 during the 2014 year so that your taxes can be adjusted to reflect the discount on your 2014 tax bill.
