#### **RABIES**

Just for the information of residents, rabies has been suspected in the town of Cormack. Please keep your animals tied on and note any incidents of strange behaviour to wildlife immediately. When reporting an incident to wildlife, it is important to include as much detail as possible including:

- date of incident
- type of animal
- details in the incident
- behaviour of animal and any variation in behaviour.
- immunization history for rabies (for domestic animals)
- possible contacts of animal (animal or human)
- location of animal
- whether animal is restrained or still at large
- owner of animal (if domestic) and owners of any animals bitten.

Any person who has been bitten by or in contact with a possible rabid animal must seek medical attention. The best first aid treatment includes thorough and immediate cleaning of the wound with soap and water.

#### **PLAN AMENDMENT**

Your town council is proposing to amend the Reidville Municipal Plan and Development Regulations to accommodate mixed development (residential and commercial) along Reidville Road from the Viking Trail and then along Rocky Brook Road to the Humber river bank to allow for the future development of an RV Park and Inn. The land in question is currently zoned Hobby Farm and Agricultural. Anyone wanting more details or having questions about this proposal should contact the council office from 9 am to 3 pm daily.

#### **PERMITS**

Residents are reminded that before beginning any construction on their property, to drop by the council office first for a permit. If you are intending to build a garage, shed or patio (basically changing the size or structure of your property), then drop by about a month before you intend to begin construction.

#### **SUMMER EMPLOYMENT**

Council has once again applied for funding to hire students for the summer. To date, no information has been received.

#### TAX COLLECTION

As of April 17, our collection rate for current year taxes stands at 68.74% up from 66.99% at the same time last year.

Those residents who have been diligent in keeping their accounts up to date are to be commended! It is through your regular payments that the town has managed to keep all creditors happy! For those residents who have not been as diligent - please note that all taxes are due to be paid in full by June 30<sup>th</sup>. If you have a prior balance on your account this has to be rectified immediately to prevent further action.

Your town depends on your tax dollars to pay for snow clearing (which can cost council over \$30,000.00 per year), road grading, garbage collection, fire protection, street lighting, administration...just to name a few.

If you have an agreement with the office on a payment schedule, please honor this agreement. Also it is worthy to note that any NSF cheques come with a \$20.00 service fee from council.
