COMPOST BINS

Just a reminder that compost bins are available from government for individual purchase of \$23.00 each. In order for these bins to be ordered for our town, a minimum order of 20 is required. WRECK VEHICLES/SPRING CLEAN UP!

Wishing to remove wrecks from your property. There are a number of businesses in Deer Lake who supply this service. Please contact either at your convenience. NOTE: The town's regulations are printed below for your convenience. Please ensure that any spare vehicles you have on your property complies with the town's regulations.

"...that any vehicle, not licensable, that does not have four tires and has major external body parts (e.g. fenders, doors) missing shall be considered a wreck and therefore has to be either removed or tarped immediately. Those individuals not complying with the town's by-law will have their wreck vehicle removed at the expense of the owner."

The main purpose of this regulation is to ensure that resident live in a clean, safe environment. Please help keep our town clean. A little from everyone can go a long way.

CAT PROBLEMS

A number of concerns have been placed with the council office in recent months with cats digging in flower beds and creating a nuisance around neighbors properties. With this in mind, council has increased its fee on nuisance cats from \$5.00 to \$15.00 per capture.
