HALL RENTAL PRICES

As of April 12, 2010, the rental prices for the community hall will be as listed:

- Weddings/Anniversary - \$200.00
- Showers - \$50.00
- Birthday parties - \$50.00
- Basement - \$25.00

There will be a refund of \$50 for weddings and anniversaries and a \$25 refund for parties and showers if the cleaning is done to the standards listed on a form that will be provided to anyone who books the hall. The bookings will now be taken at the town office at 635-5232.

TAX COLLECTION

As of April 9, 2010, the town's collection rate for 2010 stands at 96.83%. Compared with the same time last year, the town's collection rate is up from 96.16%
