As of April16, 2012, the town's collection rate for 2012 stands at 99.52%. Compared with the same time last year, the town's collection rate is up from 99.39%

Council would like to sincerely thank residents who have been diligent with the payment of their account. If you are in the percentage that does not have all of your account paid in full - the time has come and council has no choice now but to take further action! Arrears notifications have been sent out and by the end of this month if arrangements for payment are not made the maintenance man will be turning off water.

There will be a \$200 fee to have your water turned back on!

NOTE: All seniors (65 years of age or older or turning 65 any time during 2012) are eligible for an additional 5% discount.
