TAX COLLECTION

As of April 10th the town's collection rate for 2016 stands at 94.10%. Compared with the same time last year, the town's collection rate is up from 92.33%.

NOTE: All seniors (65 years of age or older - or turning 65 any time during 2016) are eligible for an additional 5% discount. Please advise the office if you will reach the age of 65 during the 2016 year so that your taxes can be adjusted to reflect the discount on your 2016 tax bill.

FITNESS CENTER

The fitness center is now open during office hours, which is Monday to Friday from 9am-3pm. Please Note: This facility is for Reidville Residents **Only.** We will also post any other time that we can find volunteers to supervise. The minimum age of user will be 16 unless accompanied by an adult. There will be no charge for use of this facility but a donation box will be on site... money collected will be used for the cleaning supplies, treadmill oils, machine inspection and any maintenance required. We are hoping that residents will get out and take advantage of this facility!!!!

Please Note: There is a Waiver that MUST be filled out before using the facility. They will be available at the town office or a supervisor will have them at the community hall if opened after office hours. The supervisor will check the book to ensure a

person has a waiver filled out before allowing use.
