 - * garbage collection
 - * fire department
 - * street lights
 - * Recreational facilities available to you

RECYCLING

Reidville Volunteer Department along with the Reidville Recreation Committee will be "sharing" all recycling proceeds from the town in coming months. NOTE: Before you place your recyclables out for collection, please ensure that **all caps are removed**. The Recycling Depot will **NOT** take any item that has a stopper on it. Thank you.

BOIL ORDER

Notice to Residents, we are still currently operating under a precautionary boil order due to a main waterline break in Deer Lake. This boil order should remain in affect for another week.

PERMITS

Spring is in the air and so to is the increase in construction. Council would like to advise residents that permits are required for new construction as well as general repairs. Any new construction requires approval from council, which could take up to one month.

LAND BEAUTIFICATION

It's the time of year for mowing lawns and keeping your property nice. Council is asking residents, when mowing your lawn, if you wouldn't mind going the extra distance to mow the ditch area as well as keeping free of debris. Close attention to your garbage box it important as well, that is the first thing people see when they enter your property.

WRECKED VEHICLES

Wishing to remove wrecks from your property. There are a number of businesses in Deer Lake who supply this service. Please contact either at your convenience. NOTE: The town's regulations are printed below for your convenience. Please ensure that any vehicles you have on your property complies with the town's regulations.

"...that any vehicle, not licensable, that does not have four tires and has major external body parts (e.g. fenders, doors) missing shall be considered a wreck and therefore has to be either removed or tarped immediately. Those individuals not complying with the town's by-law will have their wreck vehicle removed at the expense of the owner."

TAX COLLECTION

As of May 10, 2007, the town's collection rate for 2007 stands at 72.73%. Compared with the same time last year, the town's collection rate is down from 73.44%.
