WRECK VEHICLES

Spring is in the air ... and the wreck vehicles are starting to show from beneath their blanket of snow.

It is the decision of council that we have to keep our town clean from such debris and with this in mind, is offering residents an opportunity to register their wrecks with the council office for removal. There is a gentleman who will remove the wrecks for free as long as there are two back wheels in place or that two can be put in place. Please contact the town office for more details. Please note that all liabilities will be placed on the property owner. If the wreck cannot be moved by this gentleman, it will only cost you \$15.00 per wreck to have it removed and council will pay the balance. If you do not decide to take this initiative, council will be forced to remove your wreck and bill you

accordingly for the full cost of removal.

Your cooperation in this matter would be greatly appreciated. NOTE: This fee has to be paid before the wreck is removed from your property.

RECYCLABLES

The Reidville Volunteer Fire Department along with the Reidville Recreation Committee will be "sharing" all recycling proceeds from the town in coming months. If you have recycling you would like to contribute, you can either place it beside your garbage box on garbage day, drop it off in the recycling box by the community hall or bring it to the depot in Deer Lake and tell the staff it is for the "Reidville Volunteer Fire Dept". There is No Charge for a General Repairs permit for Seniors. **Please Note:** All taxes for prior years must be paid in full before a permit will be issued.

TAX COLLECTION

As of Friday May 9, 2008 the town's collection rate for the current year (2008) stands at 80.05%. Compared with the same time last year, the town's collection rate is up from 72.95%.

Council would like to sincerely thank residents who have been diligent with the payment of their account.

To those residents in arrears and not honoring agreements, please note that plans are underway to proceed with further action. The town is in the process of auctioning off arrears accounts again to ensure that collections remain up to date. Also water disconnection notices will be delivered in the coming weeks.
