#### MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS

Municipal Council elections across Newfoundland and Labrador will be held this September. Any person is qualified to be nominated for a position on council providing they reach the following criteria:

- Is a Canadian Citizen of the full age of 18 years
- Is a resident for a period of six(6) months before nomination day either in the municipality or in an area that on election day is part of the municipality
- Is not in arrears of taxes or other charges payable to the municipality.

This would be a great opportunity to give back to your community. Please think about putting your name on a ballot!!

### TAX INFORMATION

As of May 10, 2013, the town's collection rate for 2012 stands at 99.47%. Compared with the same time last year, the town's collection rate is down from 99.52%.

NOTE: All seniors (65 years of age or older - or turning 65 any time during 2013) are eligible for an additional 5% discount. **Please advise the office if** 

you will reach the age of 65 during the 2013 year so that your taxes can be adjusted to reflect the discount on your 2013 tax bill.

With spring quickly approaching please note the cost of all Permits:

Commercial :( per building) \$200.00 New House: \$100.00 House Extension: \$50.00 Accessory Buildings: \$25.00 General Repairs: \$10.00

There is No Charge for a General Repairs permit for seniors.

Most of these items will have to go to council for approval....please pick up your application or print it off the town website and submit it for the second Monday of the month.

**Please Note:** All taxes for prior years must be paid in full before a permit will be issued.

- Reidville councillors meet on the second Monday of every month to give instructions for work required in the next month.
- Any councillor can be dismissed from their seat if their taxes are in arrears
- No councillor can speak on a matter (or even be in the room) where he or she is in a conflict of interest (has an immediate family member involved).
- Council is responsible for ensuring that you have:
- \* Safe drinking water
- \* Roads clear from snow
- \* Roads graded
- \* Garbage collection
- \* Fire department
- \* Street lights
- \*Recreational facilities available...and so much more!!

Council is offering residents an opportunity to register their wrecks with the council office for free removal.

## **Town's Regulations:**

"...that any vehicle, not licensable, that does not have four tires and has major external body parts (e.g. fenders doors) missing shall be considered a wreck and therefore has to be either removed or tarped immediately. Those individuals not complying with the town's bylaw will have their wreck vehicle removed at the expense of the owner."

### **HEALTH TIP**

Cook with olive oil, add it to salads, and dip bread in it. Those who do are 41 per cent less likely to suffer a stroke than those who never eat it. Researchers using almost 8,000 people have concluded that all older people will live longer if they eat plenty of it.

The Mediterranean Diet, one of the healthiest out there, relies heavily on olive oil and is regarded as the classic eating habit in countries such as France, Greece, Spain and Italy.

Cecilia Samieri, of the National Institute of Health and Medical Research in Bordeaux, where the survey was done, said: "Stroke is so common in older people and olive oil would be an inexpensive and easy way to help prevent it.

Besides the health benefits that olive oil provides, it tastes good too.
