Council meets the 2nd Monday of every month. Due to the excessive amount of residents constructing without approval or permit, any resident that continues to construct without a permit or has been ordered to stop work council will proceed with the dismantling of the construction.

WRECKED VEHICLES

Wishing to remove wrecks from your property. There are a number of businesses in Deer Lake who supply this service. Please contact either at your convenience. NOTE: The town's regulations are printed below for your convenience. Please ensure that any vehicles you have on your property complies with the town's regulations.

"...that any vehicle, not licensable, that does not have four tires and has major external body parts (e.g. fenders, doors) missing shall be considered a wreck and therefore has to be either removed or tarped immediately. Those individuals not complying with the town's by-law will have their wreck vehicle removed at the expense of the owner."

TAX COLLECTION

As of June 7, 2007, the town's collection rate for 2007 stands at 76.95%. Compared with the same time last year, the town's collection rate is down from 76.97%.
