HEALTH TIP

Killing Germs, and Environmental Pollutants

According to the World Health Organization, environmental and lifestyle factors contribute up to 80% of all known cancers. Environmental pollutants are a main source of carcinogens which contribute between 1-10% of all known cancers. What can we do to reduce our risk staring in our home?

Environmental pollutants in our home is one area that we may be able lower our exposure easily. I'm referring to toxic chemical cleaners. This week, we address the most common ones that many of us have in our home.

These toxic substances include:

Chemicals that are irritating or damaging to the skin and/or lungs and airways

Chemicals that can induce an allergic reaction and/or cause an increased sensitivity and this includes heightened sensitivities in those that suffer from respiratory diseases.

Chemicals which emit chemical molecules in the form of invisible gas which we inhale, that enter our lungs and thus bloodstream that are considered toxic.

beginning at 9 am on <u>Sunday</u>, <u>June 20</u>, <u>2010</u> Residents are asked to please note this date on their calendar and to be sure and use caution if you happen to be washing laundry on this date.

WRECKS

This town would like to advise residents that wrecked vehicles has to tarped or removed. Council would like for residents to make a special effort to keep our town clean from such debris. Council is offering residents an opportunity to register their wrecks with the council office for removal. The fee for removal is \$25 per vehicle, council would be willing to pay \$15 (the bulk) and the resident would be responsible for paying the other \$10 plus applicable taxes. (which has to be paid up front).

Town's Regulations:

"...that any vehicle, not licensable, that does not have four tires and has major external body parts (e.g. fenders, doors) missing shall be considered a wreck and therefore has to be either removed or tarped immediately. Those individuals not complying with the town's by-law will have their wreck vehicle removed at the expense of the owner."
