NEW REGULATIONS

The town of Reidville has adopted new regulations for Traffic and Snow Clearing. These regulations were published in the Gazette on March 23, 2012 and are posted on our website. The hard copy will be available at the office for anyone to look at during regular office hours. These regulations came into effect on May 1, 2012.

SUMMER EMPLOYMENT

Council has received notification that they can employ six students for seven weeks for 35 hrs per week. Town's Regulations:

"...that any vehicle, not licensable, that does not have four tires and has major external body parts (e.g. fenders, doors) missing shall be considered a wreck and therefore has to be either removed or tarped immediately. Those individuals not complying with the town's by-law will have their wreck vehicle removed at the expense of the owner."

TAX COLLECTION

As of June 12, 2012, the town’s collection rate for 2012 stands at 99.61%. Compared with the same time last year, the town’s collection rate is up from 99.47%

Council would like to sincerely thank residents who have been diligent with the payment of their account. If you are in the percentage that does not have all of your account paid in full - the time has come and council has no choice now but to take further action! Arrears notifications have been sent out and by the end of this month if arrangements for payment are not made the maintenance man will be turning off water. **There will be a \$200 fee to have your water turned back on!**

NOTE: All seniors (65 years of age or older - or turning 65 any time during 2012) are eligible for an additional 5% discount.

WATER REGULATIONS

As of May 1, 2012 the water connection fee is \$250.00. Note: the connection fees cover the cost of providing services to your property boundary or a maximum of 25 feet which ever is less. Any and all additional cost must be born by the customer. Some of these additional costs may include any extension of waterlines (which must comply with the towns regulations). Cutting and replacing of pavement, excavating, pipe, labour and any other costs that may occur during a waterline hookup.

DOG OWNER

We are having a lot of complaints about dogs barking at night. We ask that you please keep them inside after 11 p.m. There are also dogs and cats getting into residents small gardens, please respect your neighbors...gardens can be timely and costly.

Due to the number of complaints Council has made a motion to send out letters concerning dogs and cats roaming at large, if your dog or cat is seen roaming you will get a warning letter and if your dog or cat still continues to roam a second letter will be issued and you will be fined.
