MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS

Municipal Council elections across Newfoundland and Labrador will be held this September. Any person is qualified to be nominated for a position on council providing they reach the following criteria:

- Is a Canadian Citizen of the full age of 18 years
- Is a resident for a period of six(6) months before nomination day either in the municipality or in an area that on election day is part of the municipality
- Is not in arrears of taxes or other charges payable to the municipality.

This would be a great opportunity to give back to your community. Please think about putting your name on a ballot!!

STUDENT EMPLOYMENT

Council has received notification that they can employ three students for seven weeks for 35 hrs per students week. Any seeking summer employment with the Town of Reidville are reminded that they have to have their resume submitted to the town office no later than June 21th at 2 p.m. Please Note that preference will be given applicants going to post secondary school in the fall. All applicants may not be called for an interview. The chosen candidates will be notified of date and time of interview. TAX COLLECTION

As of June 10, 2013, the town's collection rate for 2013 stands at 97.90%. Compared with the same time last year, the town's collection rate is up from 97.75%.

NOTE: All seniors (65 years of age or older - or turning 65 any time during 2013) are eligible for an additional 5% discount. Please advise the office if you will reach the age of 65 during the 2013 year so that your taxes can be adjusted to reflect the discount on your 2013 tax bill.

There is No Charge for a General Repairs permit for seniors.

Most of these items will have to go to council for approval....please pick up your application or print it off the town website and submit it for the second Monday of the month.

Please Note: All taxes for prior years must be paid in full before a permit will be issued.

ANIMAL CONTROL

There have been some concerns brought to the office concerning roaming animals these animals are tearing up garbage, barking excessively, leaving droppings on other people's property, being a nuisance etc. Please be more respectful of your neighbors! The Animal Control Officer and the Town Clerk/Manager has completed the first phase of the Inspector Certification under the Animal Health and Protection Act. The next phase will be completed within the next few weeks. When this is completed it will enable both persons to issue tickets for any offences under the act which includes nuisance animals. This act will be strictly enforced due to the number of animals roaming....please keep your animals tethered as per our animal control bylaws! Until that time, any resident can call the RCMP if any problems arise.

CIVIC NUMBERS

The 911 service will be implemented in the province in July 2014. They are requesting that everyone have the civic number posted on their property before this time.

WRECKS

The town would like to advise residents that wrecked vehicles have to be tarped or removed. Council would like for residents to make a special effort to keep our town clean from such debris. Council is offering residents an opportunity to register their wrecks with the council office for free removal.

Town's Regulations:

"...that any vehicle, not licensable, that does not have four tires and has major external body parts (e.g. fenders doors) missing shall be considered a wreck and therefore has to be either removed or tarped immediately. Those individuals not complying with the town's bylaw will have their wreck vehicle removed at the expense of the owner."

SOD FARMS/HAY FIELDS

It has come to council's attention that there have been some problems with ATV's and dirt bikes tearing up the hay fields. Please advise your youth that this is illegal and costing the owners of the fields a lot of money. If this problem continues the RCMP will have to be notified.
