Council meets the  $2^{nd}$  Monday of every month. Due to the excessive amount of residents constructing without approval or permit, any resident that continues to construct without a permit or has been ordered to stop work council will proceed with the dismantling of the construction.

## DUMPING

It has been brought to councils attention that there is garbage and animal carcasses being dumped off in the area past Cache Rapid Stables. This is illegal and council is asking that should anyone witness this please report it to the council office.

## LAND BEAUTIFICATION

It's the time of year for mowing lawns and keeping your property nice. Council is asking residents, when mowing your lawn, if you wouldn't mind going the extra distance to mow the ditch area as well as keeping free of debris. Close attention to your garbage box it important as well, that is the first thing people see when they enter your property.

# WRECKED VEHICLES

Wishing to remove wrecks from your property. There are a number of businesses in Deer Lake who supply this service. Please contact either at your convenience. NOTE: The town's regulations are printed below for your convenience. Please ensure that any vehicles you have on your property complies with the town's regulations. "...that any vehicle, not licensable, that does not have four tires and has major external body parts (e.g. fenders, doors) missing shall be considered a wreck and therefore has to be either removed or tarped immediately. Those individuals not complying with the town's by-law will have their wreck vehicle removed at the expense of the owner.'
