Council elections across Newfoundland and Labrador will be held this September. Any person is qualified to be nominated for a position on council providing they reach the following criteria: Is a Canadian Citizen of the full age of 18 years.

Is a resident for a period of six (6) months before nomination day either in the municipality or in an area that on Election Day is part of the municipality.

Is not in arrears of taxes or other charges payable to municipality.
