WATER INTERRUPTIONS ... FIRE HYDRANT INSTALLATION

Council would like to thank residents for their continued patience during the installation of the new fire hydrants in the town. The next fire hydrant installation is scheduled for Thursday and Friday, September 7th and 8th. Unless there is a scheduling conflict with our backhoe operator, the hydrants will be installed at the intersection of Rocky Brook Road and Reidville Road.

NOTE: Due to the location of this hydrant, water services will be interrupted periodically for residents from Rocky Brook and East. Also at this time, the town's boil order will also include the residents from Rocky Brook and East.

Please mark these dates on your calendar. It is virtually impossible to contact each resident individually - PLEASE MARK YOUR CALENDAR so you will be aware why you will be without water for a number of hours on either of these two dates. Council will try and limit your inconvenience as much as possible. Your continued patience is appreciated.

NOTE: While new hydrants are being installed council would appreciate it if residents stayed back from the construction site. Any site under construction is considered a safety hazzard. Your patience and understanding here would be greatly appreciated.


