There have been a few sightings of coyotes and one sighting of a black bear around the wooded areas behind Forest Road and Herb Street. Please be careful if you are in those areas.

WRECKS

This town would like to advise residents that wrecked vehicles has to tarped or removed. Council would like for residents to make a special effort to keep our town clean from such debris. Council is offering residents an opportunity to register their wrecks with the council office for removal. The fee for removal is \$25 per vehicle, council would be willing to pay \$15 (the bulk) and the resident would be responsible for paying the other \$10 plus applicable taxes. (which has to be paid up front).

Town's Regulations:

"...that any vehicle, not licensable, that does not have four tires and has major external body parts (e.g. fenders, doors) missing shall be considered a wreck and therefore has to be either removed or tarped immediately. Those individuals not complying with the town's by-law will have their wreck vehicle removed at the expense of the owner."

PERMITS

If you are intending to do ANY construction, council would like to remind residents that building applications MUST be filled out and returned to the office for council approval. Council meets the 2nd Monday of every month
