MUNICIPAL ELECTION SEPTEMBER 27TH

Mark you calendar- every resident, 18 years or older, is urged to get out and vote from 8 am to 8 pm on Tuesday, September 27th.

Did you know...that if you are unable to be present for voting on election day, that you can have someone vote for you. This is called voting by proxy. All you have to do is drop by the office before election day, pick up an application and the process will be explained to you - so if you are planning to be out of town that day, your vote can still count!

Please exercise your right and help choose your council who will lead you for the next four years.

The successful nominees for council include (in alphabetical order):

Only five out of these six nominations will be successful. NOTE: There is no separate election for Mayor in Reidville. The Mayor is chosen at the first meeting of the new council.

ANIMAL DROPPINGS

Residents are asked to note that complaints of "manure" being on any roadway are no longer being received at the council office. All complaints are to be forwarded to either the Department of Highways (if the problem is on the main road in town) or the Department of Forest Resources and Agrifoods.

Council does try and show patience when dealing with the complaints of residents however the recent

delivery of manure to the council office step was not appreciated and any future incidents will be forwarded promptly to the RCMP.

LITTER BUGS

With the assistance of the summer student program, council has been working to ensure that our roads are clean of debris. After picking up debris "3" times this summer and ensuring that the roads were clean before the summer employment program ended, it is quite upsetting to see "Tim Horton" coffee cups still on the sides of our roads. Council is asking for the assistance of residents in helping to solve this problem. Did you know that there is a fine for littering in our town? The smallest fine is \$180.00...council is hoping that if any resident sees any person throwing debris from their vehicle will note the licence plate and report the offender to the RCMP.

SPEEDERS

A number of complaints have been placed at the council office regarding speeding through town. Our youth are now back in school and council would appreciate it if drivers would pay extra special attention to their speed when driving. We have one bus turn around in town and many children are standing on the sides of the roads early in the morning waiting for their bus - it only takes one incident to change a lot of lives forever. Our children are our future. It is up to all of us to keep them safe. If you see any individual speeding

excessively, please note the time, description of the vehicle and licence number and call it into the RCMP at 635-2173.

NEW FIRE HYDRANTS

Council is pleased to inform residents that their recent request to Municipal and Provincial Affairs for some new fire hydrants in our town has been approved. \$15,000.00 has been approved on a 70/30 cost sharing ratio. In other words, council has to

come up with 30% of the \$15,000.00 or \$4500.00 to aid with the hydrant installation. It is expected that this construction will be completed by late fall.
