MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS ON SEPTEMBER 29TH

Mark your calendar- every resident, 18 years or older, is urged to get out and vote from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. on Tuesday, September 29th.

Did you know...that if you are unable to be present for voting on election day, that you can have someone vote for you. This is called voting by proxy. All you have to do is drop by the office before election day, pick up an application and the process will be explained to you - so if you are planning to be out of town that day, your vote can still count!

Please exercise your right and help choose your council who will lead you for the next four years.

The successful nominees for council include (in alphabetical order):

BARRETT, Roger of 137 Reidville Road BURDEN, Rick of 10 Circular Road GARNIER, Glenda of 22 Rocky Brook Rd. REID, David of 24 Forest Road REID, Eric L. of 136 Reidville Road REID, Helen of 5 Circular Road Extension REID, Russell of 165 Reidville Road

Only five out of these seven nominations will be successful. NOTE: There is no separate election for Mayor in Reidville. The Mayor is chosen at the first meeting of the new council.

ANIMAL CONTROL

It appears that more and more animals are roaming. Please note that all animals are required to have a town tag and that animal control for this area has increased and any animal roaming will be captured and subject to the town's animal control regulations. For the safety and convenience of residents, please ensure that your pet is secured at all times. Thank you.

PAVEMENT & UPGRADE

Council would like to inform residents that the town has been awarded some funding from the Government to have some roads paved and some upgraded. This construction should begin by the first week of October and last about a month.

Council would also like to inform residents that during the construction of the roads ditching will be done. Council is aware that some ditches have been filled in and will have to be redone. Please remember that it is against town regulations to fill in your ditches.

BOIL ORDER

The town of Reidville would like to inform residents that the boil order is now lifted. Thank you for your patience!
