On Sunday, October 4th the new council as elected by the people on September 29th were sworn into office. Members include: Mayor Helen Reid Deputy Mayor David Reid Councillors Roger Barrett Glenda Garnier Russell Reid

About 55% of the eligible residents of our town came out to vote on September 29th. The results in the polling station were as follows:

Congratulations to all candidates for taking the opportunity to throw their hat in the ring. All candidates received at least 50% of the voters' approval.
