The town has received funding under the Community Enhancement Employment Program and is seeking 2 to 3 workers (depending on the number of hours a person requires to qualify for EI) to work on the trail system. We are hoping to have this program start as soon as possible and would ask that anyone that is qualified and interested contact the town office immediately

- These positions pay minimum wage.
- All positions are open to both men and woman.
- Workers can be employed for up to 400 hours
- Individuals who require more than 400 hours of project employment in order to obtain EI benefits are not eligible to participate.

As of October 17 the town's collection rate for 2016 stands at 96.60%. Compared with the same time last year, the town's collection rate is up from 95.04%.

NOTE: All seniors (65 years of age or older - or turning 65 any time during 2016) are eligible for an additional 5% discount. Please advise the office if you will reach the age of 65 during the 2016 year so that your taxes can be adjusted to reflect the discount on your 2016 tax bill.
