### Motorists:

The town has received word that there **may** be some funding under the Community Enhancement Employment Program and is taking names of people who need hours to qualify for Employment Insurance. The requirements of this program are listed below:

- These positions pay minimum wage.
- All positions are open to both men and woman.
- Workers can be employed for up to 400 hours.
- Individuals who require more than 400 hours of project employment in order to obtain EI benefits are not eligible to participate.
- Individuals must qualify for EI by the end of the Project. For further information regarding EI eligibility call Service Canada.
