

EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY

The town has received funding under the Community Enhancement Employment Program and is seeking 2 to 4 workers (depending on the number of hours a person requires to qualify for EI) to work on the trail system. We are hoping to have this program started on Monday, November 19th and would ask that anyone that is qualified and interested have resumes into the town office by Friday, November 9th.

- These positions pay minimum wage.
- All positions are open to both men and woman.
- Workers can be employed for up to 400 hours
- Individuals who require more than 400 hours of project employment in order to obtain EI benefits are not eligible to participate.
- Individuals must qualify for EI by the end of the Project. For further information regarding EI eligibility is available for Service Canada.

TAX COLLECTION

As of November 11, 2012 the town's collection rate for 2012 stands at 99.75%. Compared with the same time last year, the town's collection rate is down from 99.78%.

Council would like to sincerely thank residents who have been diligent with the payment of their account. If you are in the percentage that does not have all of your account paid in full or arrangements made with the office - Collections, Garnish of Wages and Water Shut-offs are in the process of being done.

NOTE: All seniors (65 years of age or older - or turning 65 any time during 2012) are eligible for an additional 5% discount. Please advise the office if you will reach the age of 65 during the 2013 year so that your taxes can be adjusted to reflect the discount on your 2013 tax bill.

DOG OWNER

We are having a lot of complaints about dogs barking at night. We ask that you please keep them inside after 11 p.m. There are also dogs and cats getting into residents' small gardens, please respect your neighbors...gardens can be timely and costly.

Due to the number of complaints Council has made a motion to send out letters concerning dogs and cats roaming at large, if your dog or cat is seen roaming you will get a warning letter and if your dog or cat still continues to roam a second letter will be issued and you will be fined.
