### TAX COLLECTION

Tax collection rate for 2013 stands at 98.75%. Compared with the same time last year, the town's collection rate is up from 98.10% as of November 4, 2013.

NOTE: All seniors (65 years of age or older - or turning 65 any time during 2014) are eligible for an additional 5% discount. Please advise the office if you will reach the age of 65 during the 2013 year so that your taxes can be adjusted to reflect the discount on your 2013 tax bill.

# CEEP PROGRAM

The town has received funding under the Community Enhancement Employment Program and is seeking 2 to 4 workers (depending on the number of hours a person requires to qualify for EI) to work on the trail system. We are hoping to have this program start on Monday, November 25<sup>th</sup> and would ask that anyone that is qualified and interested have resumes into the town office by Wednesday, November 20<sup>th</sup>.

- These positions pay minimum wage.

- All positions are open to both men and woman.

- Workers can be employed for up to 400 hours.

- Individuals who require more than 400 hours of project employment in order to obtain EI benefits are not eligible to participate.

- Individuals must qualify for EI by the end of the Project. For further information regarding EI eligibility call Service Canada.
