## DISCOUNT

All taxes have been sent out in the mail. In order to receive the 5% discount available on your current year taxes, the invoice will have to be paid in full by January 31st. There is a smaller discount available for February. If your current year taxes are paid in full by February 28th you are entitled to a 3% discount. Any resident who turns 65 years of age in 2022 will be eligible for an additional 5% senior's discount. You may be exempt from Poll Tax if your previous year's income is below the basic personal exemption for the previous year. The amount for 2021 was \$13,808.00. You must have a copy of last year's tax return notice of assessment to qualify.

## DOMESTIC WOOD CUTTING PERMIT!

Permits for the Town's domestic wood cutting block are now available. Permits can be applied for and printed online at [my.gov.nl.ca](http://my.gov.nl.ca) - this is the preferred method for obtaining a permit and you will have your permit immediately. If you are unable to do this online, you can call Forestry in Pasadena at 709-686-2071 to make arrangements to have your permit mailed to you or to pick up in person.

## ELECTRONIC PAYMENT OPTION FOR TAXES

If you would like to pay your taxes online, you can do this in two ways:

- You can set up the town as a biller in your online banking. Search for "Reidville, Town of" in the list of billers. Your account number is located on your invoice on the top left corner under your mailing address.
- You can send an email transfer to the town using the email address: [townofreidville@nf.aibn.com](mailto:townofreidville@nf.aibn.com) Use **taxes** as the password.

**SNOW CLEARING**

**PLEASE BE ADVISED: It is illegal to dump snow onto a public roadway.**

This notice is for those locals who push snow across a public roadway, which leads to narrowing of roads, the buildup of snow that can be dangerous to motorists, and a nuisance to other residents. A number of cases have been reported to the council office and further action will have to be taken if this continues.

Please be sure that you have your garbage box and path (if required to get to the box) cleared of snow on garbage day. If it is not cleared your garbage will not be taken. It is too time consuming and difficult for the contractor to be cleaning off the top of garbage boxes or trying to get through deep snow to collect garbage.

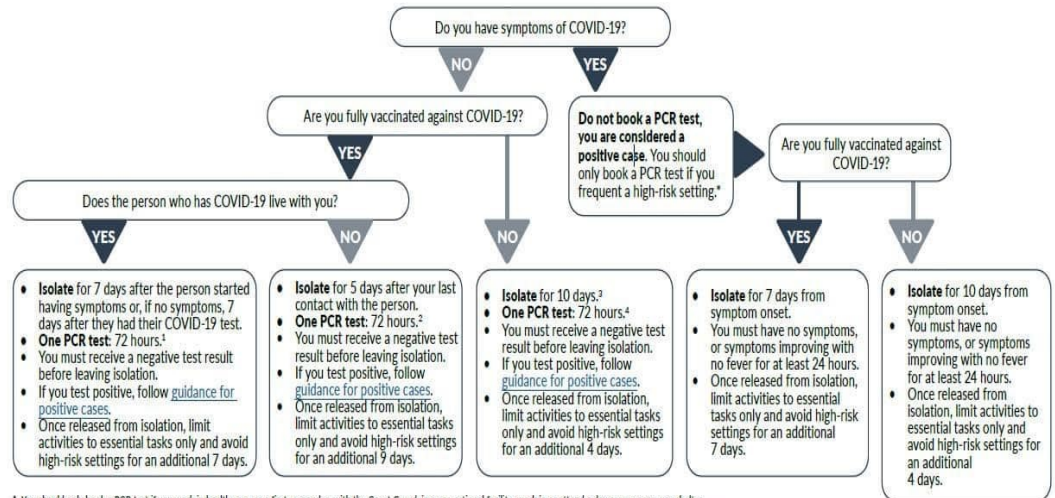

**You've been exposed to someone who has COVID-19. Now what?**

If you develop symptoms at any point, you are considered a positive case. Isolate immediately and complete this questionnaire again for guidance.



<sup>\*</sup> You should only book a PCR test if you work in health care, as a first responder, with the Coast Guard, in a correctional facility, work in or attend a day care, emergency shelter, transition house, or other housing program serving vulnerable populations; or, you live in a long-term care facility, personal care home, community care home, or assisted living facility.  
<sup>1</sup> Get a PCR test 72 hours after the person in your household started having symptoms or, if no symptoms, 72 hours after they had their COVID-19 test.  
<sup>2</sup> Get a PCR test 72 hours after your last contact with the person who has COVID-19.  
<sup>3</sup> Isolate for 10 days after the person in your household started having symptoms or, if no symptoms, 10 days after their COVID-19 test. If the person does not live with you, isolate for 10 days after your last contact with the person who has COVID-19.  
<sup>4</sup> Get a PCR test 72 hours after the person in your household started having symptoms or, if no symptoms, 72 hours after they had their COVID-19 test. If the person does not live with you, get a PCR test 72 hours after your last contact with the person who has COVID-19.
