**SPRING CLEANUP**

It's that time of year again when we all like to get our properties ready for summer. The town's annual spring clean up will take place on Saturday, June 8<sup>th</sup> beginning at 8:00 a.m. This will be a one day event....all items will be picked up during that day by the town garbage truck or town truck. All items for clean up are to be placed to the edge of your property by 8 a.m. Please put metals and wood in separate piles as they have to go to different locations. Anything that can go in bags has to be in CLEAR BAGS!!!

Items approved for cleanup:

- Metals
- Wood/brush cut into 4 foot length and bundled
- Small household furniture
- E-Waste (television, computer, etc)
- Stove, Fridge, etc.
- Small car parts
- Boxes not weighing more than 20 pounds.

Items NOT approved:

- Paint cans (drop off is the paint shop)
- Tires (drop off to any garage)
- Hazardous Waste
- Loose debris (everything must be boxed or bagged)
- Oil tanks, propane tanks
- House/Shed renovation or demolition materials
- Wood/trees or branches more than 4 feet not bundled
- No regular household garbage or recyclables will be picked up during cleanup.

If you have any questions about something that is not on the list call the town office for clarification.

## HYDRANT FLUSHING

The Reidville Volunteer Fire Department will be doing hydrant flushing on Monday evening, May 27th. This has not been a problem in recent years but there could be some discoloration in water.
