**SPRING CLEANUP**

It's that time of year again when we all like to get our properties ready for summer. The town's annual spring clean up will take place on Saturday, June 13<sup>th</sup> beginning at 8:00 a.m. This will be a one day event...all items will be picked up during that day by the town garbage truck. All items for clean up are to be placed to the edge of your property by 8 a.m. Please put metals and wood in separate piles as they have to go to different locations. **NO BAGS**...anything that can be bagged can go out for regular garbage.

Items approved for cleanup:

- Metals
- Wood/brush cut into 4 foot length and bundled
- Small household furniture
- E-Waste (television, computer, etc)
- Stove, Fridge, etc.
- Small car parts
- Boxes not weighing more than 20 pounds.

Items **NOT** approved:

- Paint cans (drop off is the paint shop)
- Tires (drop off to any garage)
- Hazardous Waste
- Loose debris
- Oil tanks, propane tanks
- House/Shed renovation or demolition materials
- Wood/trees or branches more than 4 feet not bundled
- No regular household garbage/recyclables to be picked up during cleanup

If you have any questions about something that is not on the list call the town office for clarification.

**Dog Complaints**

There have been some concerns brought to the office concerning roaming dogs and cats. The town's bylaws state a dog or a cat has to be on a leash or tethered at all times. Please be considerate of your neighbours.

**Untidy Properties/Wrecks**

It has been noted that there are some properties that need to be tidied up—members of council will be out and about in the next couple weeks having a look. If you have old tires that you want to dispose of, they can be dropped at any of the garages in town. Our town has always been noted as a beautiful, clean town....please do your part to ensure we remain that way.
