## SPRING CLEANUP

It's that time of year again when we all like to get our properties ready for summer. The town's annual spring clean up will take place on Saturday, **May 15th beginning at 8:00 a.m.** This will be a one day event....all items will be picked up during that day by the town garbage truck. All items for clean up are to be placed to the edge of your property by 8 a.m. Please put metals and wood in separate piles as they have to go to different locations. **NO BLACK BAGS...** clear bags can be used for garden waste, rags, etc.

Items approved for cleanup:

- Metals
- Wood/brush cut into 4 foot length and bundled
- Small household furniture
- E-Waste (television, computer, etc)
- Stove, Fridge, etc.
- Small car parts
- Boxes not weighing more than 20 pounds.

Items **NOT** approved:

- Paint cans
- Tires (drop off to any garage)
- Hazardous Waste
- Loose debris
- Oil tanks, propane tanks
- House/Shed renovation or demolition materials
- Wood/trees or branches more than 4 feet not bundled

No regular household garbage/recyclables to be picked up during cleanup  
If you have any questions about something that is not on the list call the town office for clarification.

**TOWN ISSUES**

The town has notified the RCMP about a bonfire that was lit in the middle of the cul-de-sac at the end of Old Rocky Brook Road. Not only is there a huge mess left behind with broken bottles, wire from burned tires, etc. that the town will have to pay someone to clean up but it is extremely dangerous. If anyone has any information please call the local RCMP.

There has been some large mud covered tree stumps dropped at the bonfire site behind the ball field that the town will have to pay to get rid of. If anyone is aware of who dumped these stumps please call the office. We have asked that people only put wood and brush that can be burned easily in this area. If this continues we will have to put a stop to any wood being dropped.

It has been noted on a couple occasions of vehicles passing other vehicles on Reidville Road. This is illegal and dangerous. The RCMP have been notified.
