Walking Trail Damage:

-from the Tramway Parking Lot to the Humber River and return.

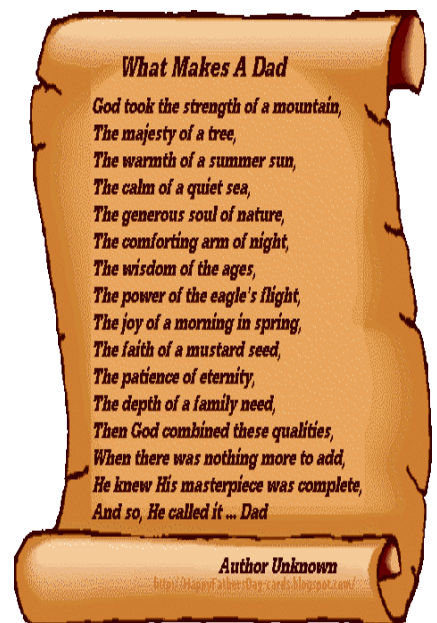
