The town of Reidville is currently seeking four individuals to work on a 17 week Job Creation Partnership Project. This project will consist of building a piece on and renovating the existing shed/kennels as well as maintenance of town facilities/properties. Please note: there may be some work hours during evenings, weekends and holidays.

The Job Creation Partnership program shall only be used to assist eligible individuals who:

- 1. Are a resident of the province;
- 2. Are Canadian citizens or permanent residents legally entitled to work in Canada
- 3. Meet the definition of EI-eligible;

a. An active EI claimant; or,

b. Had a benefit period that ended within the previous 60 months
