JOB CREATION PARTNERSHIP

The town of Reidville is currently seeking two individuals to work on a 10 week Job Creation Partnership Project. This project will consist of building a gazebo, benches, garbage boxes, landscaping around the community building and renovating the existing lookouts as well as maintenance of town facilities/properties. Please note: there may be some work hours during evenings, weekends and holidays.

The Job Creation Partnership program shall only be used to assist eligible individuals who:

1. Are a resident of the province;
2. Are Canadian citizens or permanent residents legally entitled to work in Canada
3. Meet the definition of EI-eligible;
 - a. An active EI claimant; or,
 - b. Had a benefit period that ended within the previous 60 months
